In the Gospel this weekend Jesus rebukes an unclean spirit and orders the spirit to come out of the person. The unclean spirit earlier in the reading says to Jesus "I know who you are—the Holy One of God." This line gets me every time. The unclean spirits know who Jesus is? The unclean spirits proclaim Jesus as the "the Holy One of God." Do I proclaim Jesus as the Holy One of God in my life? Do I live my life so that others would know by my actions and words that I believe that Jesus is the Holy One of God? Interesting that evil knows who Jesus is instantly upon seeing him. Evil knows who Jesus is and what Jesus can do and the authority he has. And evil believes. Do I? Do you? Sometimes in our western society we think we have control and authority over our lives. I think that is why we often have trouble with surrendering our lives totally over to Jesus. We think we have control and know better. I will be taking this line to pray this week: I know who you are-the Holy One of God. LENT 2024: We are quickly approaching the season of Lent. I invite you to pray about the three pillars of Lent and how you will engage with them: Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving (acts of charity).

THE SNOWSHOE PRIEST



Bishop Baraga

Winter has finally arrived and as we adjust to the snow and cold, we reflect on a priest who knew this season well, Bishop Baraga, also known as the Snowshoe Priest.

Frederic Baraga was born on June 19, 1797 and was the first bishop of the Diocese of Marquette. Father Baraga was a Catholic Missionary who lived and worked with the Ojibwa from 1831 to 1868 in the regions of Lake Superior and Lake Michigan. He was known for his zeal and compassion for the Ojibwa during a time when they were being pressured for removal when the fur traders were working against them.

Fr. Baraga proved a tireless missionary, traveling hundreds of miles by foot, including using snowshoes during the long, harsh winters. He converted thousands of Chippewa and Ottawa and other natives, and he ministered to the settlers, including those who came north for the copper boom.

Fr. Baraga was elevated to bishop by Pope Pius IX on November 1, 1853. He was the first bishop of the Diocese of Marquette

Bishop Baraga died on January 19, 1868 and is buried in a chapel constructed for him at <u>St. Peter Cathedral</u>, in Marquette, Michigan.

Bishop Baraga was declared <u>venerable</u> by <u>Pope</u> <u>Benedict XVI</u> on May 10, 2012.
