Faith Formation News

This weekend we hear the story of the Good Samaritan. Oh yes, we all know the story, do we? As I read over the Gospel for this weekend the last two lines of the Gospel caught my heart: Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robber's victim? He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

Mercy: forgiveness and kindness. How am I kind to others and forgiving? Last year as you know, well if you read my articles. I worked on the virtue on generosity. What about Mercy? Am I a merciful person? Do I go out of my way to be merciful and help others in distress? Sometimes I know I hold back; I think to myself "mind your own business." Sometimes I just do not feel like stopping to help. I have a list, a plan and place to be, I can't stop to help.

Over these past few months with so many changes and issues going on for myself and all of us. I have been noticing myself overcoming some of my excuses for not offering mercy and kindness to others: strangers, friends, family, co-workers, and bosses. When I get home in the evening tired and crabby, I just want to sit down and be. Then I decide I really need to check in with my mother. She spends most days home alone all day. So, I call and listen. It really is a small gesture of mercy.

Maybe in these small acts of mercy and kindness, which indeed Jesus is calling us all to do today's Gospel. Prepares us for the times when there is a huge and difficult situation facing us. In that moment I will know what to do if I have practiced being merciful and kind in the small ways. In the moment I pray I will step out of my selfishness and be mercy for the hurting, the sick, the poor, the lonely, the miserable, the rude person, the stranger who looks different. That I will see Christ in each person, in each situation and treat all with mercy: kindness and forgiveness.
