Faith Formation News

This weekend we hear about Jesus sending out the disciples. He tells them what they will be doing and what they ought to take with them. "Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick— no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic."

So, as I read this the disciples got to take a walking stick and sandals! Really! That is it? I have been looking at the insides of my closets lately. They are full of stuff, clothes, and shoes. What is all that stuff? How much does one person need? Not all that for sure. I think it is time to clean out and give things away to those who are in need. It is interesting to look at the gift of order in our lives. The proper order of our lives and of things helps bring peace and calm into our lives.

I wonder if Jesus is also talking about the simplicity of our spiritual lives as well. If we do need a lot of "stuff" to proclaim the Good News, to anoint and heal the sick, to have authority over unclean spirits? Maybe summer is a good time to look at the practices of our order in our spiritual lives as well? Maybe going back to basics is good practice this summer? Pray, every day, set a time aside to be quiet before the Lord, to sit in stillness with the Lord. Read Scripture and reflect on how it applies to your life. Participate in the sacramental life of the Church. Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Maybe you need to get back in the habit of going to Mass every week! Yes, every week. Practicing Catholics go to Mass every weekend. Receiving the Blessed Sacrament is the center of our lives as Catholics. Receiving the very Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ! Wow that ought to bring us to our knees. That alone ought to spark in us a desire to be at Mass every weekend.

Maybe this summer it is time to go back to basics. To just one pair of sandals, one tunic and a walking stick. Maybe it is time to believe that you are called to have authority over unclean spirits and to heal the sick. Maybe Jesus is calling you to a deeper relationship with him through prayer, scripture and receiving him in the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist. Believe. Trust. Begin.
