#### **Faith Formation News**

During this Lenten season our 7-12 graders put together gift bags for the children at Our Brothers Keeper, a homeless shelter in Big Rapids. Our young people did an outstanding job putting together these bags. We were able to find out that these children liked arts and crafts. So, the bags were full of art supplies, crafts, gifts, and snacks. The K-6<sup>th</sup> Graders collected snacks and food items for the shelter.

We talked to the children about what it might be like as a young person or child to live in a shelter. It was shared with them that the school bus picks up the children at the shelter and brings them there after school. What might that be like for these children? That they don't have much in the way of "stuff." That they must be able to carry everything they own.

It was interesting to watch the children and young people's faces as we talked about living in a shelter. They seemed to start putting things together as we talked. That you would not have your own room. A cell phone! A game station or Xbox! It was a good lesson for all of us.

This past week I took the gift bags and snack/food items over to the shelter. The first time I went to Our Brothers Keeper was a couple of weeks ago. It was cold and windy that day. Everyone was inside. I did not realize I had to ring a bell to get someone to come to the locked door. It seemed lonely, but good that people who are homeless had a place to get inside out of the cold. This time it was warmer out when I went. There were several men outside the shelter. When I got out of my car they asked if I had donations. They came over to my car and helped me unload. It was very touching and heart warming to me. Then a person working/volunteering at the shelter came out and talked with me. I am so proud of our children and young people. I know their parents helped them, so hats off to our parents as well. How is your Lenten almsgiving going? Maybe it is time to step it up!

**Retreat**: The Retreat last Saturday was fantastic! All who came were blessed in some way. We had a great turnout from all three parishes. My hope is that we can do another retreat in the future.

#### The Catholic Church West in Michigan

The Diocese of Grand Rapids is one of seven dioceses in the State of Michigan. The other six include the Archdiocese of Detroit, the dioceses of Gaylord, Kalamazoo, Lansing, Marquette, and Saginaw.

The Diocese of Grand Rapids was established on May 19, 1882. Originally the diocese consisted of much of the west and northern lower peninsula of Michigan. Since 1971, the diocese comprises of 11 counties: Ionia, Kent, Lake, Mason, Mecosta, Montcalm, Muskegon, Newaygo, Oceana, Osceola, and Ottawa.

The total population of our 11-county diocese is estimated at 1,429,430 (Census data as of June 30, 2019). Of that number, the Catholic population is 175,114.

There are 79 parishes in our diocese. There are 100 priests in the diocese. Fifty-nine (59) are active in the parishes, 39 are retired, and 2 are serving outside of the diocese. There are 26 Catholic elementary schools with approximately 5,000 students and 5 Catholic high schools with over 1,300 students.

The Cathedral of Saint Andrew is the Mother Church of the Diocese and is located at 215 Sheldon Blvd SE in Grand Rapids. Bishop David J. Walkowiak is the 12<sup>th</sup> bishop of our diocese beginning his service in April 2013.
